ADMISSION TESTING & SCHOLARSHIP QUALIFICATION

- La Lumiere School requires all applicants for the ninth grade to take an Entrance Exam that is offered in late Fall and Winter of each year.
- The Entrance Exam was designed by the La Lumiere faculty to gain a better understanding of a student's current academic level. While the exam is an important piece of the admissions process, a student's qualification for admission does not rest solely upon their performance on the test.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES & COMMUNITY SCHOLARS

- La Lumiere School recognizes special academic achievement by awarding scholarships to students achieving exemplary scores on the first two administrations of the Entrance Exam.
- La Lumiere School, in cooperation with the Unity Foundation of La Porte County, awards scholarships ranging from \$500 to half-tuition, and in some cases more.
- Eligibility is based upon outstanding academic record, superior test scores and exceptional citizenship. Applicants must write a scholarship essay (topic provided by the School).

Lawrence P. Sullivan Scholarship: awarded annually to the student(s) who exemplifies the characteristics of the true scholar-athlete or scholar-artist.

William P. Linnen Scholarship: awarded annually to the student(s) who exemplifies leadership based on character.

Raymond E. Daly Scholarship: awarded annually to the student who exemplifies and exudes the true meaning of living a Christian life.

James R. Moore Scholarship: awarded annually to the student who exemplifies a love for reading and writing.
